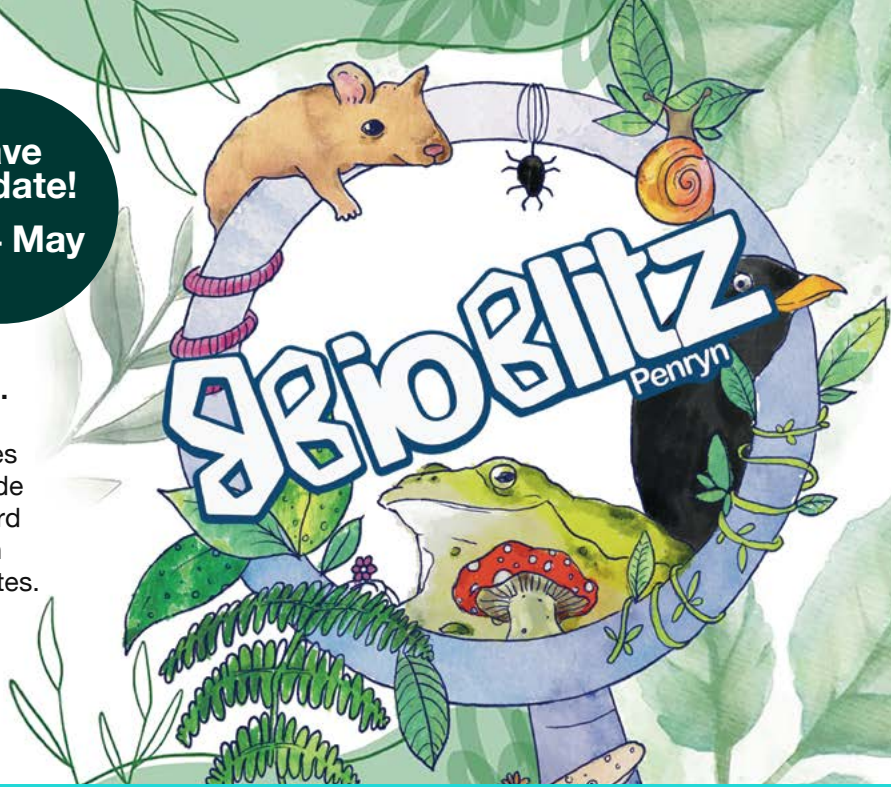

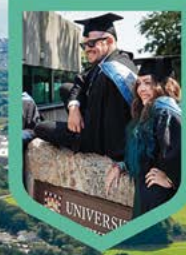
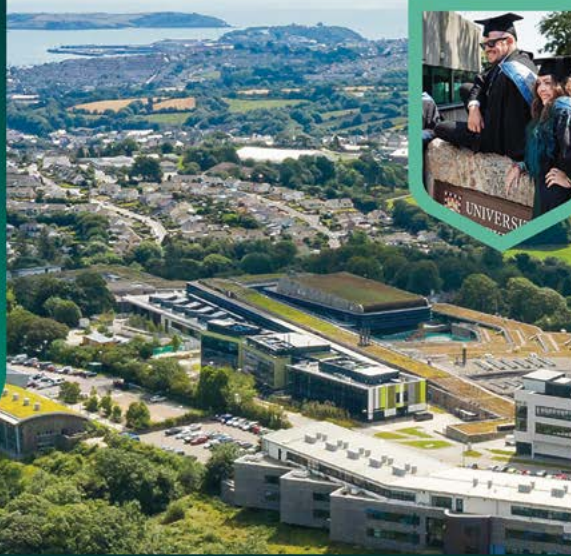

Ancient seaweed bed helping in fight against climate change

Scientists have discovered that the Fal and Helford Estuary Special Area of Conservation supports a vast seabed of maerl, a rare and ancient seaweed, equivalent to the size of nearly 900 rugby pitches.

The research project, commissioned by Cornwall Council, has found that the ancient seaweed is extremely efficient at storing carbon at an estimated rate of 841 tonnes of CO₂ annually. University of Exeter is working with the Council and other partners such as Falmouth Harbour Commissioners and Ocean Conservation Trust to protect the valuable ecosystem from threats such as anchor damage, swing moorings, nutrient discharge and sea surface temperature increases from climate change.

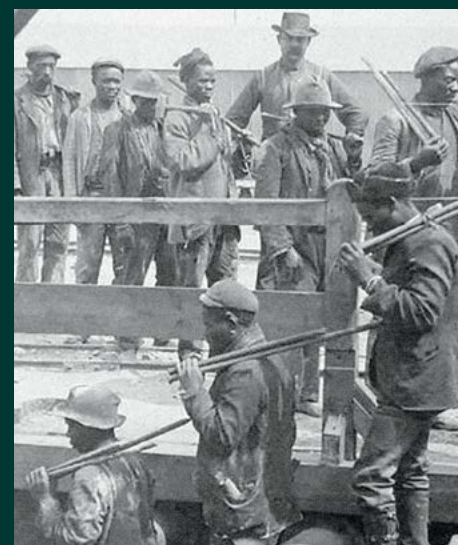

Exhibition explores impact of colonial-era mining in Africa

This archive photograph of Robinson Deep Gold Mine, Witwatersrand, South Africa (1900s) is a starting point for a new creative project by Madeline R Young (Camborne School of Mines, University of Exeter) and photographer Guy Martin (Institute of Photography, Falmouth University).

Their collaboration blends archival evidence, visual arts and sensitive storytelling to explore how colonial-era mining in Africa has impacted landscapes, human relationships and local communities – topics which resonate with Cornwall's history and leadership in the global mining industry. University secures record research funding award

New creative possibilities are on the horizon following an unprecedented £7 million funding award for a Falmouth University research programme.

The Expanding Excellence in England (E3) funds from Research England will support the development of our new Centre for Blended Realities, where innovation in the arts combined with cutting-edge computer science could revolutionise creative endeavour.

“This development will have a long lasting and far-reaching impact,” said Falmouth’s Professor Lee Miller, who explained that blending the real world with the virtual could lead to entirely new art forms and a level of user immersion previously only imagined. University Vice-Chancellor Emma Hunt added: “We’re proud that Falmouth is recognised as being at the forefront in this emerging field, where creativity meets technology.”

Capturing the reality of Cornish womanhood

Fran Rowse, a Falmouth Fashion Photography BA graduate born and raised in Cornwall, is giving a voice to the lives and aspirations of young women growing up in the county through her project *Cornish Maids*.

Empowering the South West

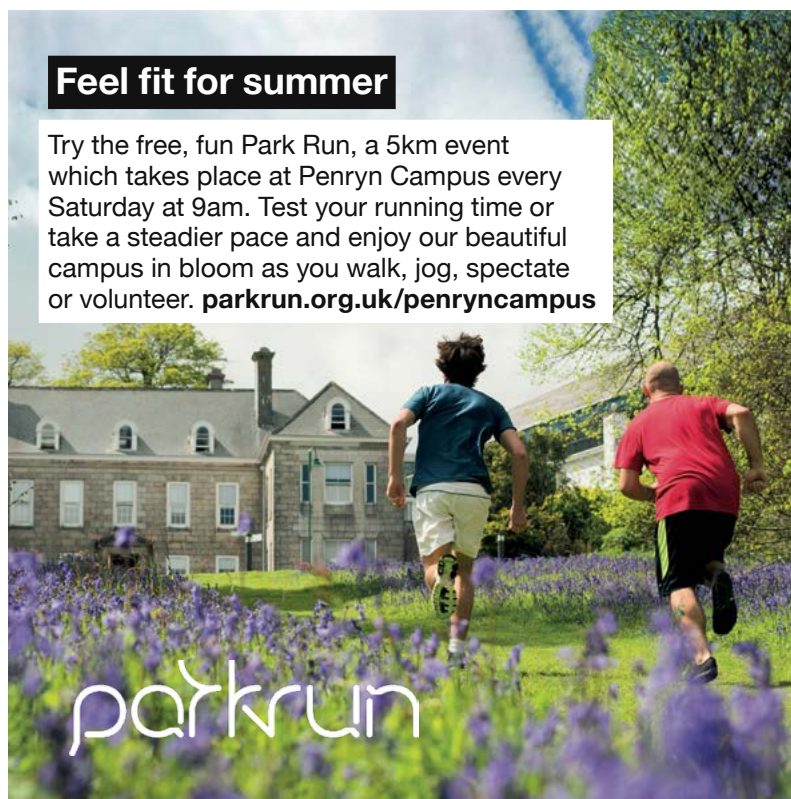
